A year ago I wrote about a roller coaster ride we were all experiencing in this economy. Well, many of us are still on that “not so much of a thrill” ride! Economic stress is often at the root of the emotional stress and abuse families experience, and brings them to our doors for service at Tennyson Center for Children. There has been plenty of that stress to go around this past year and it has brought far more children and families searching for healing than in previous years.

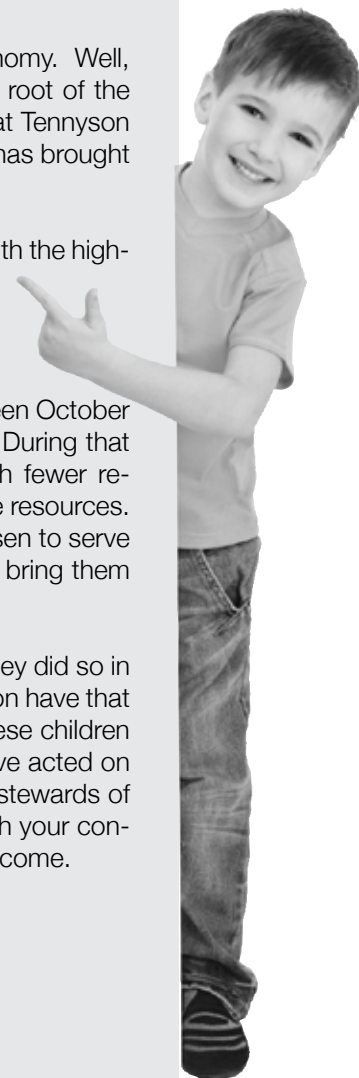
Once again our outstanding legion of staff, volunteers and donors has responded with the highest quality services. We all know what these children and families need—care, education and treatment—and we are committed to provide nothing but the best.

With the severe cuts in spending for children’s services by government entities and school districts, the child-serving community of agencies has suffered tremendously. Between October 2007 and October 2009, 23% fewer children were served in residential care in Colorado. During that same period Tennyson Center’s residential services increased by 9%. Professionals with fewer resources to place children in care have to be very discriminating about how they spend those resources. So when they do refer to our program, it makes me very proud that we are the agency chosen to serve these children. I am confident it is the quality of our programs and positive outcomes that bring them back.

Three private agencies closed their doors to residential treatment this past year. They did so in large part because they did not have the community of volunteers and donors we at Tennyson have that supports our mission. We are here after 105 years for one reason...you. You recognize these children are in need of quality care. You have made these children a priority in your life and you have acted on this commitment. We take your commitment very seriously and strive to be the very best stewards of the gifts you provide. As I look ahead, this roller coaster ride still looks pretty scary; but with your continued support, I am very confident we shall service children and families for many years to come.

Programs and Services

Residential. Residential treatment remains a needed mental health service option on the continuum of care for children and adolescents. Tennyson Center for Children (TCC) offers four residential cottages providing milieu therapy and individualized treatment plans for youth ages 5 to 18 years old with a community-based and family-focused perspective. The programming utilizes interventions focused on areas of therapy, education, health, recreation, spiritual growth, social skill development, independent living skills and healthy relationships. Focus remains on shorter lengths of stay and bridging services of care to lower levels so that families may be reunified or that youth may move or return to a natural community setting. Since January 2009, TCC has been involved with the long-term outcomes study with The Colorado Association of Family and Children's Agencies (CAFCA). This exciting study will track outcomes of progress, treatment effectiveness and service delivery in residential care.

Educational Services and Day Treatment. TCC's on-grounds school continues to be a leader among alternative school sites. Accredited by North Central Association of Colleges and Schools (NCA), the educational programming utilizes special and regular education teachers to provide individualized educational planning for each student. Teacher and staff retention is demonstrated year after year. The school offers elementary and secondary educational services for residential, day treatment, and public school students. Public school placement and stabilization is the goal for each student; a comprehensive and individualized school transition plan is developed and implemented in conjunction with the student's school district. TCC also offers a unique program, IDEAL, for Denver Public School District students. Also successful this year was the creation and implementation of the first year of summer school supported and funded by Colorado Department of Education.

School-Based Education Services. TCC's collaboration and partnership with local public school systems allows service delivery for students which helps them successfully maintain public school placement. TCC's Day Treatment classroom at Mark Hopkins Elementary School in Littleton, CO, serves three school districts, offering a specialized day-treatment program. Our staff also serves in the role of Public School Support Specialist (PSSS) within Douglas County School District. This program utilizes PSSS to bring short-term interventions to the student's natural classroom setting as well as to assist with behavior-management training for the staff involved. School districts also refer to Tennyson for consultation and provision of behavioral and therapeutic services.

Community-Based Family Services. TCC offers a number of community-based programs to serve children and families when the driving philosophy is to provide prevention and intervention in the child's home and/or school to avoid more intensive and restrictive placements. We work together with the referring agency and family to increase child protection and safety, reduce family conflict,

stabilize basic needs and successfully reunify a child with the family after out-of-home placement. Staff utilizes the family systems approach, focusing on the family and its adaptation to the community. Treatment interventions include therapy, case management, behavior management support, and advocacy. Spanish-speaking and culturally-specific home based services can be provided by our team of bilingual staff. An exciting accomplishment in 2009 is the demonstrated success of the Home Environment Alternative to Residential Treatment (HEART) program. Launched in the fall of 2008, this program was born out of a partnership with Jefferson County department of human services in order to meet the increased needs of some families. Our goal is to support the family, teach new skills, and help each child have a permanent home. TCC was awarded a Statewide Strategic Use Fund through Temporary Assistance to Needy Families (TANF) to assist in expansion of this program.

Positive Behavior Support. TCC's school is a leader of alternative school sites in Colorado utilizing a nationally researched and effective behavior support program. The national model of Positive Behavior Support (PBS) is a "broad range of systemic and individualized strategies for achieving important social and learning outcomes while preventing problem behavior" (PBS Manual, Sugai and Horner, September, 2005.) In 2009 there was continued integration of this intervention between the school and residential programming, as well as utilization of the PBS data tracking system, SWIS, to access individual client trends to develop needed interventions and measure progress with behaviors. TCC staff also teaches portions of PBS to parents.

Experiential Learning. Experiential learning is woven into many aspects of Tennyson's services for youth through community-based activities, community volunteers and creative on-grounds programming. The weekly REC groups for residential kids involve activities such as dance, arts, music and sports. The Challenge by Choice program, offered to a core group of youth in the summer, is based in experiential learning to assist them in emotional and physical growth through hiking, outdoor wilderness activities, and camping.



THIS YEAR IN REVIEW

During the calendar year of 2009, we served 404 children and over 1,100 family members in all of our programs. As federal, state and county budget cuts prevail within the child welfare system, TCC is working with referral partners to insure service delivery to youth and families in need. Increased revenue sources and cost-sharing, as well as the demand for intense services in a shorter period of time, per each individual case is a current trend. TCC is monitoring needed program changes and alternative funding sources to assure strong programming for youth and families.

DEVELOPMENT OVERVIEW

In fiscal year 2009, our development efforts raised \$3,909,535 in gift revenue, including \$1,093,749 from estate gifts, over \$950,000 from events, over \$485,000 in e-giving and direct marketing, \$696,200 in corporate support and over \$370,000 in foundation support. Additionally, our dedicated corps of 1,017 volunteers donated over 20,000 hours of their time to help fulfill our mission of service to children.

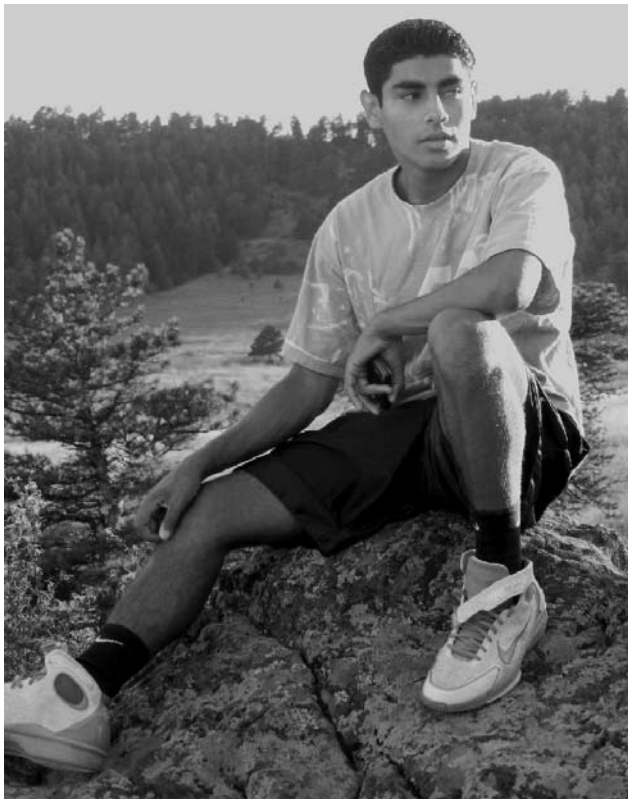
Carlos — One Child at a Time

Excerpts from Carlos' award winning essay, "History of Me"

"I have overcome so many adversities in my life. I moved more than 20 times before the age of 5. I was not allowed to stay with my mom because of her drugs and drinking problems. I went to live with a relative and was always getting into trouble. One time I was thrown down the stairs in our basement and left there. Once when I didn't wash a dish right, all the dishes were taken out of the cupboard and I had to wash them over and over again.

I did not attend kindergarten and missed much of 1st, 2nd and 3rd grades. I was expelled from school in the 3rd grade. At age 9, I had to move to Tennyson Center. I was one of those kids who got in trouble a lot. I was full of anger.

Eventually my behavior at Tennyson Center started to improve more and more and I received more privileges. I learned that it pays off to be good. After getting to know me, the Cowlings wanted me to come live with them. At first, I was afraid to leave Tennyson Center because it seemed I had been there so long and it had become home to me. But I had to leave sooner or later. I had a lot of difficulties in my new home. I wasn't ready to be with another family so I stayed in my room a lot. Learning in school had been very challenging for me because I missed so much education in my first 10 years just trying to survive everyday.

Things are so much better now. I am now in the 9th grade and play running back on the football team, Gold Crown basketball, run track, snowboard and wakeboard. With hard work and support from my family and teachers, I have been able to maintain a 3.1 GPA.

So now I know anything is possible with persistence. I have hope that my future will turn out to be great." —Carlos



"There are no pictures of Carlos as a baby. He moved so much, living in pretty rough places, even in cars. His life was chaotic and he witnessed violence firsthand. There were times we were tested when he moved into our home and we doubted ourselves. But from the day he moved in, we knew he was meant to be our son. After a couple of years of struggling and through much prayer I learned how to reframe things with him. His behaviors revolved around his fears and he needed to know that no matter how bad he was, we were not going to leave him. After those first two years, things got better and now, things are

great. He's in high school and has friends, plays in sports and recently attended homecoming. He has won many awards and wants to pursue college. He's a natural athlete, his buddies call him Michael "Carlos" Jordon. Our family continues to volunteer at Tennyson Center for Children. Carlos has shared some of his experiences with the children there, and its not surprising, they can relate to what he has to say."
